## SYLLABUS DETAILS LAW SCHOOL PREPARATION 15- 18

### Outline

The aim of this course is to inspire and support '*budding young lawyers*'. It is aimed to be for high school level students who are thinking about becoming lawyers and wish to learn more about the law and what being a lawyer is all about.

The specification provides insight into, and experience of, how the law works, stimulating learners' curiosity and encouraging them to think like a lawyer, and ultimately enable them to make informed choices about further study and about career choices.

The overall teaching and learning strategy for this Law Preparation course is 'student centred'. A variety of teaching and learning methods are employed such as; exciting and innovative workshops, engaging lessons, court visits, university taster sessions, a mock trial, and case law sessions, in order to ensure the acquisition and development of the appropriate knowledge and skills, and to achieve the stated learning outcomes.

### **The aims of the learning outcomes are as follows;**

- To understand the application process in applying to study Law at University and to thoroughly prepare you for all aspects on entering University to study Law
- To develop students' knowledge and understanding of the fundamental doctrines and principles that underpin the law of England and Wales, particularly in the workings of the English Legal System
- To provide students with the key intellectual skills (analysis, synthesis and problem-

solving) and practical skills necessary to practice as a lawyer

- To equip students with legal research techniques and the ability to analyse and effectively communicate legal research
- To equip students with the transferable skills of communication, team- work and autonomous learning
